

Faith and Character Education

Islamic teachings are the heart of our school, seamlessly integrated into every aspect of student life.



Daily Practices: Each day begins and ends with dua (prayers), creating a spiritually uplifting environment. Students perform Salah together in a peaceful, well-equipped prayer space, fostering a sense of unity and devotion.

Faith-Centered Activities: Weekly Surah Kahaf recitations and themed assemblies encourage reflection and spiritual growth.

Islamic Celebrations: Events such Muharam, Ramadan Challenges, Eid- ul-Fitr, Hajj and Eid ul-Adha celebrations deepen students' connection to their faith.





Character Development: Through regular goal-setting and pastoral care, students learn to balance academic success with personal and spiritual growth.

Service to Ummah: Our students actively engage in community service, including charity fundraising and orphan sponsorship, homeless projects, residential visits and up to 10 hours of community service work.





Character building: – pupils from year 7 study the ILM to Amal curriculum, to build on both Islamic knowledge while working toward setting ambitious targets to build character based on the Quran and Sunnah

Our Curriculum

Our curriculum at Islamiyah Girls' High School is designed to provide a balanced and well-rounded education, combining academic rigor with personal and spiritual growth. It prepares students to excel in their studies, pursue higher education, and succeed in life while staying rooted in their faith.

Key Stage 3 (Years 7-9)

Students build a strong foundation in core subjects and are introduced to a broad range of disciplines:

- English: Developing language proficiency, literature appreciation, and critical thinking.
- Mathematics: Fostering problem-solving, analytical skills, and practical applications.
- Sciences: Hands-on learning in Biology, Chemistry, and Physics to ignite curiosity.
- Religious Education: Exploring Islamic principles, Quranic studies, and comparative religion to deepen faith and understanding.
- **Humanities:** History and Geography lessons cultivate awareness of cultural and global contexts.
- Languages: Arabic and Urdu help students connect with their heritage and faith.
- PHSE: learning about the world around us, health and wellbeing and healthy relationships
- Creative Arts: Art and Design Technology promote self-expression and innovation.
- Business Studies (Year 9)/ICT: Developing business acumen, building digital literacy, and fostering computational thinking.
- Physical Education: Encouraging fitness, teamwork, and a love for sports.
- Enrichment: This includes, public speaking, Archery, work in the community, planning, local and international projects

Key Stage 4 (Years 10–11)

As students progress to Key Stage 4, they specialize in subjects aligned with their career aspirations, focusing on GCSE preparations:

- English Language, English Literature, Mathematics, Sciences (including separate sciences), History, Urdu, Religious Studies, Business and Arabic (optional)
- Islamic Studies: Continues with an emphasis on Islamic jurisprudence, moral teachings, and faith in practice.
- PHSE- learning about the world around us, health and wellbeing and healthy relationships
- Physical Education: Encouraging fitness, teamwork, and a love for sports.
- Faith Integration: Islamic values are interwoven into all lessons, ensuring students develop a strong moral foundation alongside academic knowledge.
- STEM Focus: Enrichment activities and projects encourage students to explore careers in Science, Technology, Engineering, and Mathematics.
- Career Readiness: Skills such as public speaking, essay writing, and research are sharpened to prepare students for further education and professional success.
- Personalized Learning: Differentiated teaching strategies cater to varied learning needs, ensuring every student can achieve their potential.

Our curriculum is regularly reviewed and updated to align with educational standards and the needs of a rapidly changing world.

Admission Procedure

Islamiyah Girls High School works closely with parents and local primary schools to ensure a smooth and transparent admission process.

How to Apply:

1. Obtain an Application Form:

- Visit the school office from Monday to Friday between 8:30 am and 3:30 pm to collect the form.
- Alternatively, download the form from our website: www.ighs.org.uk. Completed forms can be emailed to info@islamiyahschoolblackburn.com.

2. Submit the Completed Form:

• Include the following documents: A copy of your child's birth certificate. Recent school reports (for admissions into Years 8-11).

3. Pay the Admission Fee:

A non-refundable fee of £150 is required to secure your application.


Admission Process by Year Group:

Year 7 Admissions:

- Admission is based on a combination of CAT test results, primary school SATs scores, and an interview.
- The CAT test evaluates aptitude in English, Mathematics and Science.

Year 8-10 Admissions:

- Consideration is based on reports from the student's previous school, including attendance, behaviour, and academic performance.
- An interview with the student and parents is required to ensure alignment with our school ethos.



Uniform

At Islamiyah High School the students school uniform reflects their attitude to learning. The simple yet elegant uniform complies with the Islamic dress code, which the pupils are encouraged to adhere to. Each child will be expected to wear the full school uniform.

- Black blazer with school logo and teal piping


